

## ADULT CARE WORKER APPRENTICESHIP



There were 1.75 million paid jobs in adult social care. The majority of these roles are at operational level, for which the Level 2 Care Worker and Level 3 Lead Care Worker is suitable, working with adult service groups.

Social care is the term given to a wide range of care and support for people with assessed need.

In social care this standard provides a suitable way to meet the development and qualification needs of a variety of roles and job titles, including care workers, community, support and outreach workers, personal assistance, supervisors and senior care workers.

The apprenticeship standard is inclusive of emerging roles in adult social care. As well as being suitable for existing staff, this apprenticeship gives apprentices extensive opportunities to gain employment in the social care sector as well as in some health care roles.

**Duration:** It will typically take 12 months to complete this apprenticeship

### Entry Requirements:

Valid DBS

### Intermediate

GCSE grades A-D in English and maths

### Advanced

Progression from level 2 apprenticeship or a formal level 2 qualification with the relevant experience of working in a Health and Social care environment. A-C in English and Maths or capability to achieve functional skills Level 2.

### Progression:

Successful completion of the level 3 could lead to a higher apprenticeship or a degree in Health and Social care or employment within the sector.

- Strong interest in the health and social care sector
- Reliable and trustworthy
- Good written English and Maths skills
- Willing to work unsociable hours
